## To our Innovation Partners & Stakeholders,

2022 marked the Michigan Israel Business Accelerator's (MIBA) return to in-person programming after a two-year hiatus due to COVID. During this timeframe, we learned to be agile and leverage technology to develop connections between our Israeli and Michigan partners. This agility resulted in a 135% increase in collaborations in Michigan yielding almost \$2.9 million in economic activity for the state of Michigan.

While we continue to leverage virtual platforms, this year reminded us that there is no substitute for human connection. For the MIBA, 2022's return to in-person programming was paralleled by increased connections, innovation, and continued growth. Two delegations to Israel brought renewed progress to our mission of "Accelerating Michigan's economic growth, one Israeli Innovation at a time." Not only do our missions allow delegation participants to experience Israeli history, culture, and innovation, they also allow our delegates to gain first-hand access to technologies that can address their own business goals. Our March 2022 Defense Mission and May 2022 Mobility Mission to Israel, each with tailored itineraries to the industry-specific interests of 25 delegates from Michigan, resulted in over 500 connections and 52 active collaborations. One such collaboration resulted in Israeli-based Electreon signing a fiveyear agreement to develop and implement the United States' first scalable in-road electric vehicle charging network in Detroit.

This year's Innovation Report provides an overview of the MIBA's activities and overall outcomes for our funders, stakeholders, and ecosystem partners. On behalf of the MIBA's Board of Directors and staff, thank you for your continued support and partnership with our organization. Your support allows us to continue our role as the state's lead partner for promoting commerce and industry partnerships between Israel and Michigan. We sincerely appreciate your commitment to the MIBA and look forward to continuing our work with you.

# Who We Are

The Michigan Israel Business Accelerator is a 501c(3) and 501c(6) nonprofit economic development organization that generates economic growth opportunities between Michigan and Israeli companies, expands job creation and supports bilateral trade. The MIBA is funded by the state of Michigan, philanthropic partners and corporate sponsors committed to accelerating Michigan's innovative ecosystem through Israeli business connections.

We are also the state's appointed lead export partner to Israel, helping Michigan companies identify and connect with potential customers and partners in Israel.

At the MIBA, we concentrate on six focus areas that align with the shared strengths of the Michigan and Israeli innovation ecosystems

## **Mobility**

- Michigan is home to 16 Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM)
  headquarters and tech centers, 375 Research & Development centers, and
  61 of the top 100 auto suppliers.
- Michigan has the highest mechanical and industrial engineering concentration of talent, over four times higher than the national average.
- Michigan has the most extensive network of autonomous vehicle and mobility testing infrastructure in the U.S. with the nation's friendliest laws for testing self-driving cars.

#### **Defense**

- Michigan is home to the Detroit Arsenal-U.S. Army Tank-Automotive Armaments Command (TACOM) which manages the Army's ground equipment supply chain and constitutes about 60 percent of the Army's total equipment.
- Michigan is home to the Ground Vehicle Systems Center (GVSC), the U.S.
   Armed Forces' research and development facility for advanced technology on ground systems.

## **Food & Agricultural Technology**

- Michigan is the most diverse agricultural state in the U.S. with a reliable source of water.
- Michigan is No. 1 in production of 20 different commodities including blueberries, tart cherries and three kinds of dry beans.

## **Health Technology**

- Michigan ranks in the top 10 for the number of medical device technology business locations in the U.S.
- Michigan's University Research Corridor (URC) is the No. 1 cluster for undergraduate and advanced degrees in medicine and biological science.



# **Advanced Manufacturing / Industry 4.0**

- · Michigan is home to the U.S.'s first Industry 4.0 accelerator program.
- Manufacturing makes up 20 percent of Michigan's Gross Domestic Product.

## **Sustainability Technology**

- Michigan aims to increase their recycling rate to 45 percent through the efforts of the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE).
- The C3 Accelerator is committed to bringing innovative technologies to Michigan and connecting them with partners, customers, and grants.






#### Goals

# 2022 Michigan Israel Defense Delegation

The MIBA returned to Israel in 2022, taking its first delegation in over two years after COVID-19 restricted international travel. Fourteen Michigan business leaders spent a week immersed in the Israeli defense ecosystem. The delegates met with leaders of Israel's 'Big 3' defense companies, connected with companies at Israel's largest defense conference and met one-on-one with defense companies during Business to Business (B2B) matchmaking meetings coordinated by the Israel Ministry of Defense's SIBAT division.

The MIBA delegation itinerary includes cultural and educational experiences, making this a life-changing trip both personally and professionally for all delegates.

After two years of teleconference meetings, the power of face-to-face interactions was on full display during this trip. 263 business connections were made and 25 collaboration opportunities were created during and in the weeks following the mission.
















# 2022 Michigan Israel EcoMotion Delegation

Just two short months after the defense trade mission, the MIBA returned to Israel, bringing II Michigan mobility leaders. Co-chaired by Michigan's Chief Mobility Officer Trevor Pawl and Michigan Department of Transportation Director Paul Ajegba, the delegation experienced first-hand the advanced innovations of the Israeli smart mobility ecosystem.

The cornerstone of this trip was the EcoMotion Smart Mobility Conference, Israel's largest conference dedicated to showcasing mobility solutions. Both Trevor Pawl and Paul Ajegba were featured speakers and panelists at the conference and Michigan Economic Development Corporation hosted an exhibit, bringing attention to Michigan's leadership position in the future of mobility. In addition to the conference, the Michigan delegates shared thought leadership with the Israel Ministry of Transportation and made visits to innovative companies like Electreon Wireless and Via Transportation.

The mobility delegation resulted in more than 270 connections being created that led to 27 collaboration opportunities. And almost as importantly, excursions like the walking tour of Jerusalem, the culinary tour of Jaffa, and a visit to the Yad Vashem Holocaust Museum made for a well-rounded, meaningful experience for all.











# **Success Story Highlight: Electreon Wireless**

The MIBA's biggest success story of 2023 came in the form of a growing partnership between Michigan and Israeli smart mobility firm, Electreon.

Electreon Wireless is tackling one of the most challenging problems preventing widespread adoption of electric vehicles: the need for fast, reliable charging. Their solution? Create a system where vehicles get charged wirelessly while in motion or stationary! This technology allows for smaller, lighter, and less expensive batteries as well.

The MIBA first met Electreon in November, 2020. After months of discussions, Electreon and the State of Michigan announced a \$1.9 million pilot project that will bring the country's first electrified road to Detroit.

While in Israel for the EcoMotion Mission Trip, a Michigan delegation that included representatives from the state of Michigan, the delegation visited the campus of Electreon, igniting discussions on how to expand project opportunities.


As a direct result of those discussions, last September, Electreon and the State of Michigan announced a much broader five-year agreement that will set the blueprint for scaling this technology in Michigan and the U.S. This new agreement will tap into government, engineering, construction, and supply chain resources to set the policy and regulatory framework needed for widespread and large-scale deployment.
